## ADELAIDE

### WHAT WE'VE LEARNT SO FAR

The Crows have averaged 365 disposals and 181 handballs at a kick-to-handball ratio of 1.02:1 in the NAB Cup. So we know they are going to handle the footy a lot more. The other change or improvement if you like is the forward-line. Last year they converted inside 50s into goals the least of any team. In the NAB Cup they have ranked No.1 kicking a goal 34.8% of the time.

#### Bernie Vince ✓

Maybe this bloke is in Neil Craig's midfield plans. I was reluctant to talk about him last week because he sucked everyone in during the 2006 NAB Cup, but I reckon he is there for good. In three games he has averaged 17 disposals and 61 DT points in just 67 minutes per game.

#### Brett Burton ✓

Injuries restricted Burton's output last season and as a result looks to be tremendous value after two impressive NAB Cup games. He has averaged 14 disposals, six marks and 82 DT points per game – 18 more than his 2007 H&A average.

#### Brad Symes ✓

Symes has averaged 19 disposals, four marks and two tackles in 74 minutes during the NAB Cup. This bloke has shown as a kid and throughout his four years at Port Adelaide that he can win lots of the ball.

#### BEWARE ? Adelaide gus

Adelaide's three leading midfielders in 2007 were Simon Goodwin, Tyson Edwards and Chris Knights. These three boys have spent a lot of time up forward and on the bench which has affected their NAB worth. How Neil Craig uses them in the H&A is a mystery so you might be better off looking at other clubs for the gus.

Norm Dare compared this bloke to Michael Voss at the same age. He still has a lot of work to do. In three games he has averaged 33 DT points which included a score of just seven last week.

### SHERMANATOR ✓ Justin Sherman

I mentioned him last week and I am again this week because the message is, GET ON! While his average of 67 DT points isn't great, it's still more than what his actual price suggests. The way he is playing is exactly what he did in 2006.

# CARLTON

## WHAT WE'VE LEARNT SO FAR

Carlton will rely heavily on its known stars in the midfield. Their midfield; without the likes of Nick Stevens, Chris Judd, Heath Scotland, Marc Murphy, Andrew Carrazzo and Adam Bentick, struggled to negate an under-manned Eagles midfield finishing with 22 fewer disposals, 14 fewer clearances and 12 fewer inside 50s. At the moment they haven't unearthed any DT bargains in the midfield.

### Bret Thornton ?

Thornton has spent less time in the Blues' defence, instead being used in a roaming role further up the ground. He is averaging 66 DT points and his NAB worth is \$80,000 more than his actual price. These scores may be misleading because when the real stuff starts he could find himself back in defence.

### Ryan Jackson ?

With the Blues missing all of their gun midfielders, Jackson was able to step up and play a more important role against the Eagles last week. He finished with 22 disposals and a DT score of 74 – however his scores will surely decline once the big names start to return.

### Jordan Russell X

Russell was a top 10 selection at the 2004 NAB AFL Draft and was seen as a potential AFL midfielder. He has struggled to have any real impact in his first three seasons on the Blues list and has not had any boom of form during the NAB series. Stay away from him as his NAB worth is \$46,000 less than his actual starting price.

### GIBBS A FUTURE DT STAR Bryce Gibbs ✓

Gibbs assumed the role of Carlton's captain in Alice Springs against the Eagles. He performed just as a leader should, finishing with the equal most disposals for his side and picked up 76 DT points. His starting price is currently \$87,000 lower than his NAB worth, so consider Gibbs early as his price may continue to rise as the season progresses.

# COLLINGWOOD

## WHAT WE'VE LEARNT SO FAR

The Magpies played most of their best 22 in Saturday's game against the Power where they went down by 35 points. It's fair to say they've been one of the most disappointing clubs in the pre-season so far kicking just 23 goals. Despite their form, they still buck the AFL trend by preferring to kick and mark which makes plenty of their players worth considering for your DT.

### Cameron Wood ✓

If you thought Wood only played well against West Coast two weeks ago because Fraser was out of the side, think again. With both in the side against the Power, Wood was still a good DT point scorer, finishing with 73 points thanks largely to his tally of eight marks.

### Chris Egan ✓

Modest scores throughout his career up forward mean Egan presents good value now that's he's spending time in the midfield. He picked up 21 disposals and 76 DT points on the weekend, following up his 17 disposals and 62 points the previous week.

### Travis Cloke ✓

There aren't many traditional lead and mark forwards these days which makes Cloke a valuable commodity. He had 15 kicks and took eight marks against the Power, of which six came on a lead. He never stops working and while his kicking isn't great, all kicks score three points – whether they end up out on the full or not.

### NO THANKS ✗ Sean Rusling

For a variety of reasons, Rusling should not be considered for anyone's 2008 DT. For one, he's expensive at \$266,000. Add to that his knack of always getting injured and the fact that he's too up and down when he is fit. Do yourself a favour and fork out an extra \$30,000 and select Barry Hall.

# ESSENDON



## WHAT WE'VE LEARNT SO FAR

Essendon will give its youngsters every chance to shine in 2008. It has given all four of its rookie's a run in the NAB Cup and all but nine of its players have been given game time. Four regulars are yet to have played - Matthew Lloyd, Dustin Fletcher, Jason Winderlich and Andrew Lovett.

### Jobe Watson ✓

There was only one thing stopping Watson from being a DT superstar in 2007 and that was his lack of game time. Once again he has been used sparingly off the bench in the 2008 NAB Cup and has averaged 70 DT points spending just 61% of game time on the ground.

### Jason Johnson ✗

Johnson played all three NAB Cup games but spent just 67% of those games on the ground. His opening game was impressive but he averaged just 42 DT points in his next two appearances. At 30 years of age his DT days are over.

### Jay Neagle ?

The leading goalkicker of the 2005 TAC Cup booted four goals from just five kicks against the Saints - finishing with 47 DT points. There is a little bit of Scott Welsh about him as he obviously knows how to kick a goal but doesn't find enough cheap footy to warrant selection for your DT side.

### BARGAIN ✓ Jay Nash

Nash has played two NAB Cup games so far this season and has been prominent in both. He has averaged 73 DT points and has also shown he is a hard runner ranking second at the Bombers in handball-receives as well as having the highest uncontested possession rate (81%) of any Essendon player during the NAB Cup. Perfect DT play.

# NORTH MELBOURNE

## WHAT WE'VE LEARNT SO FAR

The lowest DT point scorers in 2007, North Melbourne have been difficult to read in the pre-season so far. They handballed their way to victory against Brisbane a fortnight ago but then went back to the long and direct style of play that DT coaches loathe in their win over Fremantle. Whatever game plan they go for, I reckon they're destined to be a low-scoring team again.

### Leigh Harding ✓

After a year out of the game, Harding is a cheap buy at \$151,500. Being used in defence means there's more chance of him to find some cheap ball and three solid games in the pre-season means he's worth considering, at least just to make you some cash.

### Aaron Edwards ✓

With every mark worth three points for your DT, Edwards' hands could become very valuable. He's averaged six marks in three pre-season games so far and if he starts having more impact on the scoreboard, he could be a handy addition into your side.

### Hamish McIntosh ✓

The standout performer with 105 DT points against Fremantle means McIntosh could yet again be a big improver. He racked up 21 disposals and 32 hitouts in the win – numbers that rival what Dean Cox has been doing for the past three years.

## WHAT IS GOING ON?

### Shannon Grant ?

I'm not sure what his problem is but Grant's scores of 21, 74 and 30 in the pre-season so far are well below what we've come to expect from him. Based on his form, don't pick him in your starting line-up and wait for his price to drop before considering him.
