BENCH WILL BE CRITICAL IN 2011

The importance of nailing your bench this year cannot be underestimated. Unlike previous years when we only used emergencies in case of injury or a late change, in 2011 they will be active for us most weeks. The introduction of bye(s) may cause mayhem for some, but remember that there will be no head-to-head league games during the multi-team round byes in Rounds 4, 5, 6, 16 and 19.

There are a plethora of bench options this year, with the Gold Coast Suns providing us with some great buys in every position. Youngster Alik Magin has been a standout so far, but he's currently on the rookie list and unless he gets upgraded anytime soon, he won't be eligible to play in Round 1. Nick Lower has been the pick of the bunch so far, but he too is rookie listed. Of the players that can be selected, mature-age recruit Nicholas Duigan has had an immediate impact in the Blues defence. He looks to have cemented a place in the line up for Round 1 with some solid form in his three games. He racked up a lazy 93 points last week against GWS, but we can't read too much into that. Other player's that have caught the eye are young Docker Viv Michie and Saints third-year player Alistair Smith.



Knights is as cheap as chips this year, after averaging 66 points per game from his five matches in 2010. There are plenty of coaches that have pencilled him in for Round 1, but after his first match for the year last week against Fremantle, you may have to think again. He suffered an injury scare and finished the match on the bench. Not good news if you ask me. Durability has been his biggest concern, playing more than 20 games only once across his career.

I doubt that he'll be a Podsiadly, but at 28 years of age he fits the criteria. If elevated onto the senior list before Round 1, Callinan could be a surprise selection for the Crows season opener against the Hawks. At the basement rookie price, there is also tremendous upside to him as a Dual Position Player. He was lively last week against Fremantle with 58 points courtesy of his 15 disposals and one goal.

He hasn't set the world on fire so far this pre-season, but make sure you keep him in the back of your mind nonetheless.

The fact that Drummond is already on the Lions injury list should be of no surprise to anyone. He has been hampered by a hip injury and will miss at least the next three weeks, which means that he could go into Round 1 without any match practise. That's a recipe for disaster considering what his injury history is like. Despite his tempting price, avoid him and save yourself a trade.

Gibbs will surely be one of the most selected players this season due to his dual position status. A return to the midfield is on the cards after he spent much of last year deep in defence. He was one of several Blues that dominated last week against GWS, finishing with 24 disposals and 93 points. Gibbs has been a star across the past three seasons, averaging an impressive 97 points per match in that period.

I would be staggered if Laidler didn't play in Round 1. He was starved of opportunities at Geelong, but as soon as the Blues picked him up his stocks rose. He will definitely have an impact this season and at \$177,300 he could be a good buy as a fifth or sixth defender. He didn't dominate against GWS last week, but he was still solid nonetheless with 10 disposals, six marks and 55 points.

We're yet to see Didak this pre-season, and I strongly doubt that the Magpies will play him in Perth this week. The lively forward has had an injury interrupted pre-season after undergoing shoulder surgery after the Grand Final, and he may be a little underdone going into Round 1. Take all of that into account before picking him in your side, as there is every chance that he may suffer an early price drop, especially if Mick uses him as an impact player as a substitute in the early rounds.

After averaging career-high 99 points per match in 2009, Davis got nowhere near that last season, averaging 64 points per game. His time in the midfield dried up and so did his scores, scoring over 80 points just four times. He lined up in defence last week against the Swans, and based on his performance, it could become a permanent role now that Krakouer is in the side. Monitor where he plays in the coming weeks before making a call.

Almost every man and his dog will have Heppell is their side this year, and why not? His first up performances in the NAB Cup so far have been eye-catching, finishing with 15 disposals, three tackles, two goals and 63 points last week against Melbourne. He was a ball-magnet at TAC Cup level, averaging 109 points per match and ranking No.1 in the competition for kicks and third for disposals. He is almost certain to debut in Round 1 against the Bulldogs. Jump on!

There is definitely a spot for Myers in Essendon's defence this season, with the only query being his form and durability. The former No.6 draft pick could only manage eight games last year, but he showed plenty, averaging 64 points per outing. His performance in Round 22 would have delighted Bombers fans, finishing with 29 disposals, seven marks and 109 points. He was sharp last week against Melbourne collecting 18 disposals and 58 points.

If you don't have Mzungu in your team, then do yourself a favour and bring him in. He's been a star for the Dockers so far this pre-season, dominating in both matches in Round 1 of the NAB Cup. He finished the game off strongly last week against Adelaide, collecting nine of his 22 disposals in the final term to finish with 77 points for the match. His dual position status is an added bonus and at \$97,600 you can't go wrong.

The arrival of ruckman Griffin will see Johnson settle into one position this year, more than likely in defence. He lined up there last week in the NAB Challenge clash against Adelaide and finished with a team-high 28 disposals and 109 points. He hasn't been an elite Dream Teamer to date, averaging no more than 75 points per match in any season, but I can see him topping that this year. Strongly consider.

I doubt that the Cats would confirm or deny this either way, but if we don't see him play over the next two weeks, the question has to be asked. He was a star in 2010, averaging a career-high 28 disposals and 114 points per game. Chapman is the most expensive forward in the competition this year at \$472,200.

There is a lot of Corey in the way that Duncan goes about his game. He runs hard, tackles strongly and picks up plenty of touches along the way. He played in the guts last week against the Saints and dominated scoring a game-high 112 points. Admittedly the Cats were missing several key midfielders, but the performance was of highest quality nonetheless. Despite his high starting price, I wouldn't hesitate in picking him.
