

Brownlow 2014: The two injured front-runners just hold on

- Our model is predicting a tied Brownlow, shared between Gary Ablett and Sydney's Josh Kennedy.
- Both players reach 25 votes before getting injured. But we think they've done enough to hold-off the chasers.
- Selwood is once again lurking near the top, while both Jordan Lewis and Robbie Gray make a late charge.

This year's Brownlow Medal Model suggests a tie for the Brownlow between Gary Ablett and Sydney's Josh Kennedy with both on 25 votes. The votes from the Round 12 game between Gold Coast and the Swans could prove pivotal.

However, the race is very close and Joel Selwood, Jordan Lewis or Robbie Gray could also come out on top.

It's shaping to be a year where leading the Brownlow Medal is a curse. Not only was Ablett injured in Round 16, but Kennedy also was injured in Round 21 just as he drew level with Ablett.

With the front-runners unable to add to their tally, the tension on the night will focus on the chasers, all of whom performed very well after Round 15.

Joel Selwood will have a sentimental favouritism after last year's achingly close result. In an eerie parallel this year once again sees Selwood playing well in Round 23 against Brisbane. Last year he failed to poll in the equivalent game despite 25 possessions and a goal – and then fell 1 vote short. The model says he wins 2 votes in the game this year but is 4 votes short. But the Brownlow has habit of rewarding players the season after they go very close and he can't be discounted.

Two other fast finishers are Jordan Lewis and Robbie Gray. Lewis played exceptional football in the last six rounds and wins 15 votes in our model. But he appears to have left his run a tiny bit too late. Gray has a similar pattern and is modelled to finish equal 4th on 21 votes. But Gray also played a number of strong (but non-vote-winning) games early in the year. If Gray or Lewis can pick up a few extra votes early on, they could come storming over the top in the final rounds.

Reverting to a simpler model

This year's model has gone back to basics. Last year we experimented with individual player attributes to see if we could improve the model's fit. However, we found this tended to reward players the year after they played well.

This year, we have reverted to the simpler model we used in 2012 where points are awarded for Kicks, Handballs, Goals and Hitouts. Players on the winning team also gain an advantage that rises as the margin rises. The final two variables are the score percentage and the difference between the Supercoach score and the Dream Team score.

The Score Percentage captures the notion that kicking 4 goals when your team kicks 10 for the match is more important than kicking 4 when your team kicks 30 goals.

The Supercoach less Dream Team score captures efficiency. The Supercoach scores are adjusted to reflect efficiency and when the game is still undecided while Dream Team votes are not. A player with a small number of pivotal touches at clutch times will have a much higher Supercoach score than Dream Team score. They tend to win more Brownlow votes too.

Ablett streaks to the front

Our model (like everyone's) has Ablett leading comfortably when he is injured in Round 16. He has six three-vote performances in the first eight games. He will take the lead early and he will open a wide gap. Then, after round 15, the chase will begin.

In total, Ablett is predicted to poll in 9 games. He is expected to receive 3 votes 7 times and 2 votes twice. Most of those three-vote games appear locked in. In rounds 1, 3, 5, 9 and 15 Ablett has 32 or more possessions and two or more goals.

Although Gold Coast's entire season was 10 wins and 12 losses, for the 15 games Ablett played they had 9 wins and 6 losses. During Ablett's season Gold Coast was about sixth on the ladder. Ablett's votes should follow a more normal pattern this year because of that. In fact, the model suggests Ablett can get to 25 votes by collecting 20 votes in wins and only 5 votes in losses.

Of Ablett's votes, perhaps the most questionable are the 3 votes the model suggests Ablett should win in Round 15 when Gold Coast lost by 53 points to Hawthorn. That game was, statistically at least, superb. Ablett had 45 possessions and two goals. But his team lost by 9 goals, so it's hard to know. He won 850 of our Ratings Points in that game – making it a very strong performance. (See Figure 4.)

This is a common problem with Ablett we have come across in previous years: blindingly good individual games in substantial losses. However, as last year's Brownlow attests, Ablett can still win votes in losses.

Our one concern about Ablett is there appears to be an asymmetry of risk at play. A player expected to win 3 votes cannot outperform the model. For most players, this is balanced out by winning the occasional 1 or 2 votes for performances not rated as vote winning by our model, or by winning 3 votes in games when our model predicts fewer. For most players, the risk is, across a season, symmetric.

For Ablett it is not. Ablett's votes are so concentrated that this natural balance is broken. Ablett has 7 three-vote games which come with a risk of a lesser vote, but not many where he played well, but doesn't earn a vote in our model.

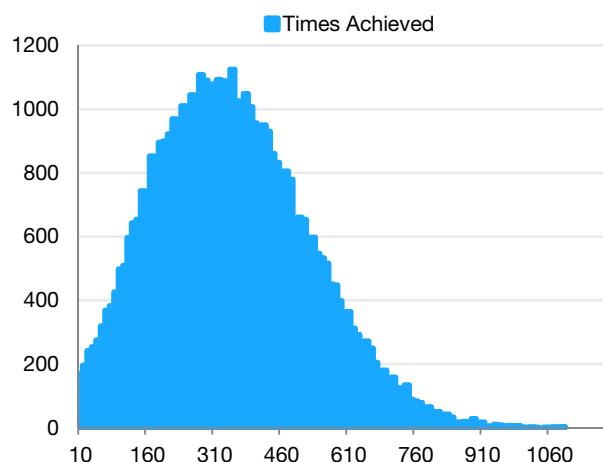
Our model mimics the Brownlow voting process by assigning points to each game action, then ranking the players. These ranks are shown in the player's summary tables at the far right. In line with Brownlow voting, the top three players receive the standard 3-2-1 votes.

Performances which are very good, but don't win votes will tend to show as games where the player was ranked highly, but not in the top 3. As such, a player who ranks 4th in a game will receive no votes in our model, but can be considered a moderate chance to win Brownlow votes.

Ablett all-or nothing pattern has him winning 3 votes 7 times, but coming 4th never and 5th only once. (See the bottom panel of Figure 5.)

About the only games where there is a risk Ablett might outperform the model are Rounds 12, 13 and 14. In rounds 12 and 14 he plays well and is modelled to win 2 votes. Obviously, any game in which a player is modelled to win 2 votes, he could potentially win 3. His Round 13 game against West Coast is also very good (33 possessions in a tight loss) and ranked 5th best on ground – though only the second best Gold Coast player, behind Dion Prestia's 38 possessions and a goal.

The Round 12 game between Sydney and Gold Coast looks pivotal and looks like Ablett's best chance to outperform our model. Our model suggests the two tied winners overall are both likely to win votes in this game, but the order is unclear. It is, to brutalise the old finals cliché, a "six-vote game". The model gives 3 votes to Kennedy and 2 votes to Ablett, but the opposite order is also possible. The three vote winners in the model for this game are:

- 3: Kennedy. 9 kicks, 19 handballs and 2 goals. A large positive SC-DT differential suggests these were impactful possessions though.
- 2: Ablett. 15 kicks, 22 handballs and 1 goal. A great game, but Gold Coast lost by 35 points.
- 1: Jack. 18 kicks and 13 handballs.

It is distinctly possible that Ablett snags three votes here. If he does, the extra vote (and 2 votes vs Kennedy) could be enough to see him winning this third Brownlow alone. Ablett has a history of outperforming his modelled votes, but that seems less likely this year. We struggle to see many "outperformance" games for Ablett. Mainly that's due to there being far fewer stellar individual games in massive losses. Those games are very difficult to predict and were a large part of why Ablett outperformed in 2011 and 2012. Nevertheless, the modelled 25 votes could be enough to win the medal this year.

The first to catch Ablett is Kennedy

Sydney's Josh P. Kennedy (not to be confused with West Coast's Josh J. Kennedy) is the first, and only, player to catch Ablett in our model. Ironically, if Josh P. Kennedy does catch Ablett, it may be his namesake that helps it happen. One of the players preventing Ablett winning votes in Round 13 is West Coast's Josh Kennedy.

Sydney's Kennedy plays consistently all year, collecting votes every second game or so (see Figure 6). After a slow start he gets 8 votes in Rounds 7-9. Kennedy continues to accumulate before drawing level in Round 20 thanks to 3 votes in the win against Port Adelaide. Kennedy was then injured in Round 21. Kennedy is a relative newcomer to the rarefied air of the Brownlow top 3, but has been both modelling (and polling) well in the last couple of years. Our model gave him 24 votes in 2012, when he won 19. The model gave him only 10 votes last year, but he outperformed and won 14 votes. (See Figure 7.) He definitely seems in the mix this year and has a history of polling near his modelled outcome. If Kennedy gets anywhere near 25 votes this year he could win.

What stands out is the number of games where Kennedy has potential to win more votes than the model suggests. Mostly these are from his 2 and 1 vote games. In Round 15 Kennedy wins 2 votes, in a game with three legitimate contenders for the 3 votes. Sydney comfortably beat GWS, but any of Kieran Jack (32 possessions and a goal) Josh Kennedy (29 possessions and 2 goals) or Lance Franklin (18 possessions and 5 goals) could claim the 3 votes. In Rounds 2 and 4 Kennedy wins 28 and 33 possessions respectively but no votes – he might also win an extra vote or two there.

Selwood a sentimental favourite?

Selwood's case for the Brownlow Medal is strong, too. He played every game and averaged 25 possessions and 1 goal a game. Our model places him fourth in the count.

Selwood's chances are likely to be won or lost in a string of strong performances between rounds 15 and 20. As well as the 3-vote performance against GWS, the model gives Selwood four lots of 2 votes over the period. These performances were (statistically) very solid without being jaw-dropping. He wins 30-odd possessions and often a goal, week after week.

Should a couple of games yield 3 votes instead of the modelled 2, then Selwood could pull ahead and win. If not, he may, once again, fall agonisingly short to winning.

Which brings us to another point. Last year Selwood was unlucky not to win – he was very close. His 25 possessions and a goal in Round 23 couldn't get that last vote he needed and he fell one short when Ablett polled 3 votes in the last round.

The voting has a history of giving players extra votes in the years straight after they were generally believed to be hardly done by in a sort of afterglow effect. Chris Judd won the medal in 2010, for example, for a season considered inferior to his 2009 season. Selwood may well pick up an extra couple of votes thanks to this effect. And in a year this close, a couple of votes can make all the difference. It certainly would have last year.

For this reason, although the model suggests Selwood has less chance of winning the Lewis, we're not quite so sure. We think Selwood has the best chance of upsetting the Ablett/Kennedy tie. This afterglow effect is very hard to model because it doesn't always hold true. But when it does come to the fore, it can cause a large impact.

A fast-finishing Lewis or Gray might swoop

In most years, a player with 8 votes at the end of 17 Rounds would be out of the running. But this year isn't most years and the medal could likely be won with comparatively few votes.

That, combined with a run of form for Jordan Lewis that most players only dream of, propels him to third place in our count. Starting in Round 18 the model suggests Lewis will win 15 votes from six games. (That's the same as Ablett in rounds 3 to 9.)

It will be a nail-baiting way to win it, but it is just possible that if Lewis picks up another couple of votes early on (perhaps in Rounds 6 or 7) he will be in the mix at the end. He's likely to finish just short, however.

Given his modelled tally of 23 votes and comparatively few chances from other "Strong Games" we don't think Lewis can win more than about 25 votes even if everything breaks his way. If he gets to that, he's then relying on neither Ablett nor Kennedy matching our model's performance. It's not likely, but we can't quite write him off, either.

The final contender for the Brownlow this year is arguably Robbie Gray (see Figure 11). His voting pattern will likely mimic that of Port Adelaide's overall performance.

He polls comparatively well during the early season while Port are winning most games and has 9 votes by Round 12. After a mid-season lull, he hits peak form in the last four games to take a further 10 votes, including three votes in each of the last three games.

Gray's other advantage is that he has a substantial number of strong games which are modelled to win no votes. If these games do yield votes, he will be able to win.

Counteracting Gray's chances is some potential vote stealing from Travis Boak. Between the two of them they're expected to win 40 votes. But if it's about 20 votes each, they'll both finish in the top 10 and neither will win.

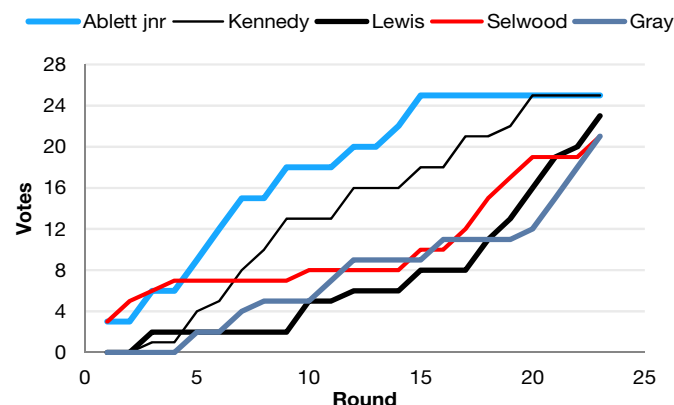
Lewis and Gray have both had 'break-out years' and seem likely (if not a shoe-in) for their debut All-Australian selections this year. A player jumping straight to the Brownlow in their first year as an All-Australian sounds strange, but is actually comparatively common.

The feat has been achieved by such previous Brownlow winners as Stynes (1991), Wynd (1992), Kelly (1995), Voss (1996), Goodes (2003), Judd (2004), Bartel (2007), Cooney (2008) and Watson (2012). That's nine times in 23 years or just under every second year. And that's not counting the two ineligible Brownlow winners (Grant and McKernan) who also topped the Brownlow voting in their first years as an All-Australian.

A final thought on Nat Fyfe

During the editing of this report we were asked how Fyfe could win the AFL Players MVP and not do better in our modelled Brownlow.

Firstly, 19 votes and equal sixth isn't too bad. But the explanation mostly comes down to the voting system. Fyfe, thanks to his two suspensions, played only 18 games. Losing four games to injury would, according to conventional wisdom, make it very hard to win the Brownlow (we know – this year is a special case). The MVP, on the other hand, is voted across the season, the extra games make no difference.

What sets Fyfe apart is his lack of mediocre games. In our model he is in the 10 best players on the ground in all but three games. That consistency wins plaudits from peers, but not as many Brownlow votes.

Of course, had he not been suspended that consistency could easily look like a number of strong games where Fyfe could poll more votes than the model suggests. We expect to be writing about Fyfe in more detail in next year's report.
